RESOLUTION

concerning

Refunds for Reclassified Students

at the State Colleges

July 13, 1973

- WHEREAS, The tuition charged out-of-state students is greater than that charged Connecticut residents, and
- WHEREAS, In the case of Vlandis vs. Kline et al., the United States Supreme Court has upheld the United States District Court (Connecticut) in its declaring unconstitutional Connecticut Public Act Number 5, Section 126, defining permanent out-of-state classification of certain students attending public institutions of higher education, and
- WHEREAS, In the fall of 1972 the State Colleges identified out-of-state students and students who are residents of Connecticut in accordance with guidelines provided by the Connecticut Attorney General's Office, now, therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That students who had been improperly classified as out-of-state residents and, therefore, charged higher tuition and other fees be refunded the appropriate amounts as indicated by such reclassification.
