SUBJECT

I have noted your communication of November 13, 1974 indicating that the Commission for Higher Education has approved the change of title of Chief Fiscal Officer in the central office to Associate for Fiscal Affairs. Evidentially, the purpose of this is to place the position in the unclassified service. I am interested to learn the rationale for such action.

In the past, I have had a number of discussions with Dr. Frost regarding the use of the professional positions as a means to circumvent the merit system. Recently, the Board of Trustees for State Colleges established a position in the central office for that of Finance. Inasmuch as the position of Chief Fiscal Officer would normally come under the jurisdiction of the higher position I am curious as to the reason for removing the position from the classified service. Further, both the Department of Education and the Board of Trustees for Community Colleges maintains a similar position in the classified service.

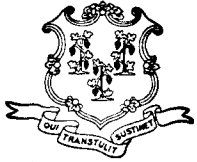

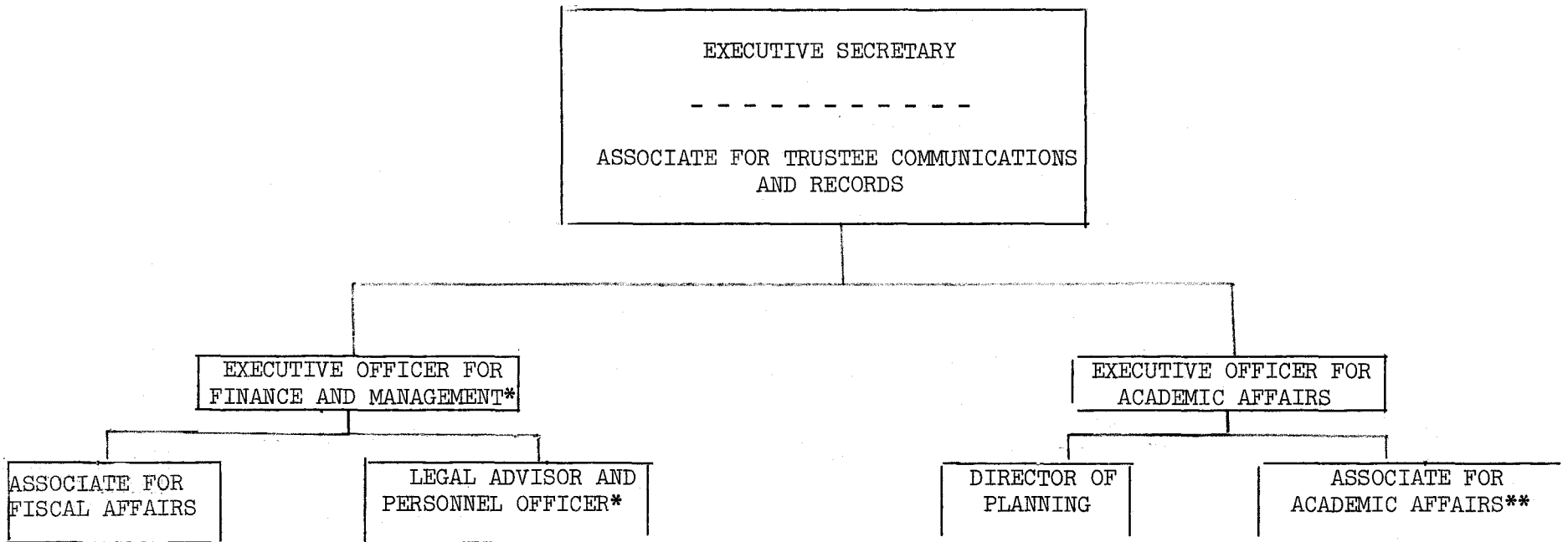
