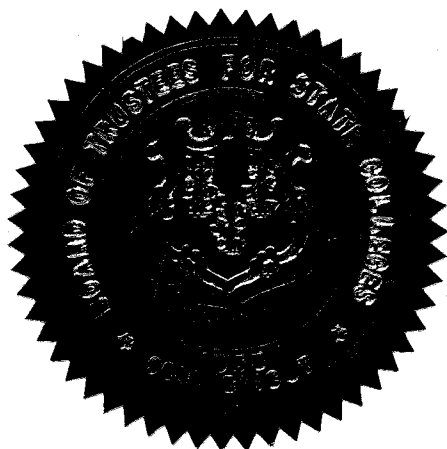

The machine is virtually maintenance free and with proper lubrication by the Ceramic staff should function without incident.

The machine will be used for processing and reclaiming white porcelain clay bodies and is capable of extruding 300-400 lbs. of clay per hour.

In addition, the machine is also equipped with an extruding unit which can extrude anything from decorative handles and coils, to hollow cylinders for sculptural constructions.
