EXTENSION OF TUITION WAIVER



- WHEREAS, Allan C. Erickson served Central Connecticut State University as Dean of Graduate Studies from 1967 to 1986 when he became Dean of Graduate Studies emeritus; and
- WHEREAS, Dean Erickson's daughter, Laurel Ann, commenced her college education at Central Connecticut State University in September 1984 under the tuition waiver plan for management employees and continued under said tuition waiver plan until the untimely death of her father in January 1987; and
- WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees for Connecticut State University can extend such tuition waiver benefits to the children of deceased emeriti; now therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That waiver of tuition and State University Fee shall be granted to Laurel Ann Erickson from the time of her father's death to the award of her baccalaureate degree.

Dear Dallas:

It has been brought to my attention that Laurel Ann Erickson, daughter of the late Allan C. Erickson, our Dean of Graduate Studies for 19 years, lost her eligibility for tuition waiver when her father died in early 1987. I have been informed that the Board has frequently extended tuition waiver to students whose employee or emeritus parent died while they were still in school. Indeed, I note that such a right has now been written into the Instructional Faculty contract. I think we can do no less for our deans and request that this benefit be extended to Ms. Erickson in consideration of her father's long years of service to Central.
