RESOLUTION

establishing

THE CENTER FOR INDUSTRIAL AND ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY

at

CENTRAL CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY

April 7, 1989

- WHEREAS, The School of Technology at Central Connecticut State University has gained recognition for its degree programs and expertise in technology fields, and
- WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Connecticut and the Governor has approved funding for a Center of Excellence in Technology at Central for the application of technology in industry and in other environments to strengthen the economy of the state, and
- WHEREAS, The academic programs in Technology at Central can benefit by having faculty and advanced students of the School of Technology work with persons in industry and public agencies on the application of technological principles to real situations, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That there is established at Central Connecticut State University a Center for Industrial and Engineering Technology which will have as its purpose the dissemination and application of technological knowledge in industry and public agencies, utilizing where possible and appropriate the talents and expertise of faculty and students of Central Connecticut State University, and be it further
- RESOLVED, That there shall be a director of the Center for Industrial and Engineering Technology, who shall report to the Dean of the School of Technology at Central Connecticut State University, and such other personnel as may subsequently be authorized according to University procedures, and be it further
- RESOLVED, The Center may receive payment for its services and may seek and receive grants and other funding provided that all such income is deposited in University accounts established for the Center and expended exclusively for Center purposes, and be it



RESOLVED, That operation of the Center for Industrial and Engineering Technology shall be evaluated by the President of Central Connecticut State University within three years of the date of this resolution for its contribution to the economic growth and well being of the state and for its ability to support and enrich the academic programs of the School of Technology, and the result of this evaluation shall be shared with the Board of Trustees, and be it

RESOLVED, That the Center for Industrial and Engineering Technology at Central Connecticut State University shall go out of existence on December 31, 1992, unless the Board of Trustees takes specific action to the contrary.
